On behalf of the NMTA Executive Board, I am pleased to provide details of the 2019 Nebraska Music Teachers Association State Conference, Competition and Festival events. The campus of University of Nebraska-Omaha, Omaha, Nebraska will host all events.

NMTA State Conference and MTNA Competitions, October 17-18 NMTA Performance Competitions, October 19 NMTA State Festival, October 19-20

The NMTA State Conference will include workshop sessions, performances, as well as a master class for the winning soloists of the MTNA Junior, Senior and Young Artists Piano Competitions. The main highlights of the conference include the following guests:

Alexander Kobrin was awarded the Nancy Lee and Perry R. Bass Gold Medal at the Twelfth Van Cliburn International Piano Competition in Fort Worth, TX in 2005. He has won numerous top prizes at international competitions and has appeared in recital at major halls worldwide. Mr. Kobrin has performed with many of the world's great orchestras and is on the piano faculty at the Eastman School of Music. He will be performing an evening recital and giving a masterclass.

Diane Hidy is well-known for co-writing the acclaimed method Piano Town with fellow educator Keith Snell. She teaches youth and adult students in San Francisco and provides practical advice for fellow teachers at her website TeachWithDiane.com. She will be giving four sessions during the conference.

Charlie Albright was recipient of the prestigious Avery Fisher Career Grant and Gilmore Young Artist award and won the Ruhr Klavier Festival Young Artist Award. He is known for making special connections with audiences by breaking the 'classical' rules and will be presenting a session about improvisation. Members can also get a special rate for his concerts with the Omaha symphony.

Bryan Stanley, 2019 NMTA commissioned composer, is published by Hal Leonard, Boosey & Hawkes and G. Schirmer. His compositions have been performed by symphonies and festivals internationally. Dr. Stanley is also active as a performer, with recent recordings and frequent collaborations at UNO and Opera Omaha's special concert events. His *Three Concert Etudes* for solo piano will be premiered at the conference.

The conference will also feature presentations by NMTA members. **Kristín Taylor**, University of Nebraska-Omaha will present a session on Grieg's *Lyric Pieces*; and **Angela Miller-Niles**, Wayne State College, will discuss using repertoire to incorporate world music into lessons. New to the conference this year will be a poster session featuring NMTA student members' research and activity.

NMTA Junior, Senior and Collegiate Performance Competitions Saturday, October 19, 2019

The NMTA sponsored student Performance Competitions will be held on Saturday, October 19, 2019 at University of Nebraska-Omaha in Omaha, Nebraska. Postmark deadline for the NMTA Performance Competitions is Wednesday, September 11.

Please note the following NMTA Performance Competition categories:

1. LEVELS AND REQUIREMENTS:

- **JUNIOR**: Students must be 11-14 years of age at the date of the competition. Repertoire program should include at least two pieces of contrasting style, with a maximum performance time of 10 minutes.
- **SENIOR**: Students must be 15-18 years of age at the date of the competition. Repertoire program should include at least two pieces of contrasting style, with a maximum performance time of 15 minutes.
- **COLLEGIATE LEVEL 1**: Students must be enrolled as a Freshman or Sophomore (current enrollment in 1st-4th semester of study) at the date of the competition. Repertoire should be at least two pieces of contrasting style, with a maximum performance time of 20 minutes.
- **COLLEGIATE LEVEL 2**: Students must be enrolled as a Junior or Senior (current enrollment in 5th or higher semester of study) at the date of the competition. Repertoire should be at least two pieces of contrasting style, with a maximum performance time of 20 minutes.
- **COLLEGIATE LEVEL 3**: Students must be enrolled at the Graduate level at the date of the competition. Repertoire should be at least two pieces of contrasting style, with a maximum performance time of 20 minutes.
- 2. Any student of a NMTA teacher is eligible, with the exception as noted in #3 below. District Festival participation is not required.
- 3. Any student entered in the MTNA competitions will not be eligible for the NMTA Performance Competitions.
- 4. Only one judge will be provided for each level of competition.
- 5. There will be three awards per division: First Place, Second Place and Third Place.

The NMTA State Festival will be held on Saturday and Sunday, October 19-20, 2019 at University of Nebraska-Omaha in Omaha, Nebraska. The registration deadline for participation in the State Festival is Wednesday, September 11. Entry fees are non-refundable.

Reminders:

Students who qualify at the District Festival may advance to the NMTA State Festival. Qualification includes receiving a I or II performance rating and 60% or better on the theory test.

Students who have previously scored 90% or above on the 4B Theory Exam may opt to take the Honors Test.

No sight reading is given at the State Festival.

Online entries after the September 11 deadline will not be accepted.
